STEEL BRIDGE TAKES 2ND PLACE AND ON TO NATIONAL COMPETITION!

For the steel bridge competition, civil engineering students are challenged to an intercollegiate competition that supplements their education with a comprehensive, student-driven project experience from conception and design through fabrication, erection, and testing, culminating in a steel structure that meets client specifications and optimizes performance and economy. The Student Steel Bridge Competition increases awareness of real-world engineering issues such as spatial constraints, material properties, strength, serviceability, fabrication and erection processes, safety, aesthetics, project management, and cost. Success in competition requires application of engineering principles and theory, and effective teamwork. Future engineers are stimulated to innovate, practice professionalism, and use structural steel efficiently.

On March 7th the Knoxville Branch had a joint meeting with the UT Knoxville Student Chapter to review competition projects prior to the annual ASCE Student Conference. The meeting was at the John Tickle Building on the UT Knoxville Campus, and was attended by about 20 Branch members, including several Younger Members. The students did a great job, and later placed 2nd overall in the competition. The Knoxville Branch is **extremely proud of our Student Engineers** for the accomplishments achieved at the 2016 ASCE National Student Conference held in Tuscaloosa, Alabama this past March. 

Program Evaluators for Civil Engineering Programs by Daryl R. Armentrout, P.E.

Are you interested in helping universities maintain and obtain their ABET accreditation for their civil engineering programs?

If you have...

- A demonstrated interest in improving engineering education;
- Current registration as a professional engineer in the United States;
- At least 10 years of experience in the practice of engineering (e.g., in industry, private practice, construction, engineering education);
- A willingness to conduct visits and perform all associated activities in accordance with ASCE and ABET requirements.
- Membership in ASCE at the Member or Fellow grade.



The time that you'll invest will be initially 12-20 hours of on-lone training and one and a half days of face-to-face training. Your first program review will be as an observer with an experienced program evaluator. As a program evaluator, you will commit about five days/year extended over July to November. You won't necessarily receive an assignment every year. Your travel expenses for campus visits will be reimbursed by ABET. 


DESIGN CHALLENGES OF SUTTREE PARK


